PUBLIC STUDY CONCERNING THE CITY'S INDUSTRIAL PARKS

There are nineteen industrial parks belonging to the city, on the territory of the urban agglomeration. These parks are located in seven Montréal boroughs as well as in the cities of Dorval and Pointe-Claire. The public study will present an overview of the industrial parks, outlining findings at large, as well as issues pertaining to the development and enhancement of these parks. The committee plans to provide recommendations to the urban agglomeration council concerning the possible orientation of interventions with respect to the city's industrial parks, in order to promote and develop Montréal economy.
