OPENING OF A REGISTER

To qualified voters entitled to have their names entered on the referendum list for the sector concerned, concerning by-law RCA11 17191-2 amending the Urban Planning By-law of Côte-des-Neiges—Notre-Dame-de-Grâce borough (01-276).

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that:

- 1. The Borough Council, at a sitting held on June 6, 2011, adopted by-law RCA11 17191-2 amending the Urban Planning By-law of Côte-des-Neiges—Notre-Dame-de-Grâce borough (01-276).
- 2. The amendment to by-law RCA11 17191-2 consists of allowing the "place of worship" use once again for the property at 5380, avenue Bourret.
- **3.** Qualified voters entitled to have their names entered on the referendum list for the sector concerned, consisting of the zone 0131 as illustrated below, may demand that this by-law be submitted to a referendum poll by entering their name, address and capacity, together with their signature, in a register opened for that purpose.
- **4.** The register will be open from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m., on June 30, 2011, at the Borough Office, 5160, boulevard Décarie, 6th floor, Salle Côte-des-Neiges.
- 5. The number of signatures needed to require that a referendum poll be held is 77. If this number is not reached, the by-law will be deemed approved by the qualified voters.
- 6. The results of the registration process will be announced in the room where the registration is held, on June 30, 2011 at 7 p.m. or as soon as they are available.
- **7.** The by-law and the plan describing the sector concerned may be consulted at the Accès Montréal office, at 5160 boulevard Décarie, ground floor, from Monday to Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.

TO BE CONSIDERED A QUALIFIED VOTER

A qualified voter is any person who is not under any voting disqualification for any reason and who meets the following conditions as at June 6, 2011:

- is of full age, a Canadian citizen and not under curatorship;
 - is domiciled in the zone from which an application may originate;
- has been domiciled for at least 6 months in Quebec.

Any sole owner of an immovable or sole occupant of a business establishment for at least 12 months as at June 6, 2011 and who is not under any voting disqualification.

Any undivided co-owner of an immovable or co-occupant of a business establishment who is not under any voting disqualification and who fulfils the following conditions as at June 6, 2011:

- has been the undivided co-owner of an immovable or the co-occupant of a business establishment in the zone from which an application may originate for at least 12 months;
- has been designated, by a power of attorney signed by the majority of persons who have been co-owners or co-occupants for at least 12 months, as the person authorized to sign on their behalf and to have his or her name entered on the referendum list, as applicable. The power of attorney must have been produced ahead of time or be produced with the application.

A legal person must meet the following conditions:

- have designated one of its members, directors or employees, by resolution, a person who is of full age, a Canadian citizen, who is not under curatorship or any voting disqualification as at June 6, 2011;
- have previously produced or produce at the same time as the application, a resolution designating the authorized person to sign the application and to have his or her name entered on the referendum list, as applicable.

Except in the case of a person designated to represent a legal person, no one may be considered a qualified voter in more than one capacity, in accordance with section 531 of the *Act* respecting elections and referendums in municipalities.


IDENTIFICATION REQUIRED
