



ENHANCED COMMUNITY NOTIFICATION SERVICE (CNS)

Notice is hereby given:

Upon publication of the present notice, the city (Ville de Montréal) will implement an enhanced community notification service (CNS). This service is a new phone notification service that will be available in emergency situations for all the citizens of the urban agglomeration of Montreal. It will use the 9-1-1 database provided by your phone supplier.

When online, this community notification service (CNS) will only be used to communicate emergency messages through your residential phone. Wireless service (cell phones), residential four-party service and nomadic Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) service subscribers will not receive messages through CNS.

This service will be used to alert you in emergency situations

For the purpose of this service, an emergency is defined as: "An imminent or occurring danger which represents a threat for the life, the health or the security of a person".

Your name will not be disclosed during the operation of this service. The use of this data has been approved by the CRTC, according to the Telecom decisions 2007-13 and 2008-37.

The areas where this service will be available are: Montréal, Baie-D'Urfé, Beaconsfield, Côte Saint-Luc, Dollard-des-Ormeaux, Dorval, L'Île-Dorval, Hampstead, Kirkland, Mont-Royal, Montréal-Est, Montréal-Ouest, Pointe-Claire, Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue, Senneville et Westmount.
