Notice is given that **special meetings** of city council will be held as follows:

The special meeting of **November 30, 2016**, will pertain to the tabling of the 2017 budget and to the tabling of the 2017 budgets of certain paramunicipal agencies.

The special meeting of **December 14, 2016**, will pertain to the adoption of the city's 2017 budget and approbation of the 2017 budgets of certain paramunicipal agencies.

Please note that the question period and council deliberations during this meeting will pertain to the above-mentioned topics, in accordance with Section 474.2 of the Cities and Towns Act.

A public question period will be held at the beginning of each meeting. Anyone wishing to ask questions must obtain a registration number, one hour before the start of the meeting, on the ground floor of the Chaussegros-de-Léry building, located at 303, rue Notre-Dame Est. However, persons with reduced mobility may go directly to city hall at 275, rue Notre-Dame Est, using the entrance located at 510, rue Gosford. The draw determining the order in which citizens may ask their questions will take place at 303, rue Notre-Dame Est, 30 minutes before each meeting. It is imperative that citizens provide a picture ID for registration purposes. Failure to do so will prevent them from registering. Registered persons will receive an ID pass that will grant them access to the council chamber so that they may ask their question.

Persons registered for the question period, as well as anyone wishing to attend council meeting, may access city hall by the east side entrance (510, rue Gosford).

The room is equipped with a hearing aid system that may be accessed by tuning in to 100.3 FM on your portable player. Moreover, an interpretation service for persons with a hearing impairment is available on request, subject to the availability of interpreters. Kindly contact 514-872-3142, at least three business days prior to the meeting.

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The city now offers a drop-in day-care centre during council meeting question periods for those meetings, from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. This service is offered free of charge, by bilingual (French/English) professional childhood educators, and is available without prior reservation. Upon arrival, parents must fill out a short form giving details on food safety, access to the child and specific needs. Parents must also supply required food, diapers and creams.
