

Cohabitation between vulnerable road users and heavy vehicles in Montréal

The Commission sur le transport et les travaux publics invites citizens to take part in a public consultation on the cohabitation between vulnerable road users and heavy vehicles in urban areas, in regards to the "Vision Zero" approach recently adopted by the city.

The *Direction des transports de la Ville de Montréal* will start the consultation by presenting a status report on the situation in Montréal, and proposing possible solutions that could be considered in order to improve the situation. In their briefs, participants will be invited to give their opinion on the strengths, weaknesses and challenges of the proposals, or to present new options.
