Montréal PUBLIC CONSULTATION

Diagnosis of public leisure activities in Montréal

The *Commission permanente sur la culture, le patrimoine et les sports* was given the mandate to carry out a diagnosis of the state of public leisure activities in Montreal in order to, among other things, identify actions to be taken to better support the boroughs and organizations regarding the development and implementation of leisure activities for the citizens of Montréal.

The Commission invites interested persons, and in particular representatives of recreational organizations active in the city, to participate in the public consultation component of this process.

The public consultation will be held in three parts. The first, an information session, followed by a question period, is intended for the presentation of a discussion document. The second part will be the hearing of opinions and briefs, and the third part, the adoption of recommendations by the committee.
