
By-law for a Diverse Metropolis

Public consultation: Technical clarifications and creation of new affordable housing zones

At its meeting on June 13, 2022, city council adopted draft by-law P-20-041-4 titled “By-law amending the By-law to improve the supply of social, affordable and family housing (20-041)”.

This draft by-law contains certain minor and technical amendments meant to ensure consistency in the expressions used and facilitate the understanding of the by-law.

It also aims to replace schedule B to by-law 20-041 to add affordable housing zones arising from changes made to the city’s planning program in 2021 for the following areas:

- Ville-Marie: The Bay real estate project area
- Ahuntsic-Cartierville: Louvain Est area
- Saint-Léonard: Jean-Talon Est SPP

In accordance with the Act respecting land use planning and development (CQLR, c. A-19.1), a public consultation meeting will be held to discuss this draft by-law.
