

## **PUBLIC NOTICE**

## **PUBLIC CONSULTATION MEETING**

The Borough of Saint-Laurent of the City of Montreal will hold a public consultation meeting regarding the purpose and consequences of the first draft by-laws number **RCA08-08-0001-154** and **RCA08-08-0001-155** amending by-law number RCA08-08-0001 on zoning, adopted on August 9, 2022. This meeting will be held on **August 23, 2022**, at 7 p.m., in the council room of the borough hall located at 777, boulevard Marcel-Laurin, Saint -Laurent.

The first draft by-law number RCA08-08-0001-154 aims to:

- Amend the Zoning By-law to:
  - Increase the time for planting a tree to replace a felled tree from 6 months to 1 year;
  - Make a new building in the "Service (S)" use group subject to the development of a strip of green space along the side and rear lines of the lot;
  - Increase the width of a bicycle parking space provided for a dwelling h3, h4, h5 and h6 to 40 cm:
  - Supervise the extension or enlargement of a non-conforming use protected by acquired rights for a dwelling in use classes h1, h2, h3 and h4;
  - Prohibit the extension or enlargement of a non-conforming use protected by acquired rights in the Technoparc zones;
  - Add terms to the terminology index;
  - Adjust the delimitation of zones C03-048 and H03-035 with the lot limits;
  - Specify the number of parking spaces in zone S16-031;
  - Update certain normative provisions and terminologies;
  - Correct clerical or transcription errors.
  - Some of these provisions are subject to referendum approval and may affect the entire territory of the borough.

The first draft by-law number RCA08-08-0001-155 aims to:

- Amend the zoning by-law to add special provisions for elementary schools located in high-density areas of the Borough in zone C08-080.

This provision is subject to referendum approval and affects zones C08-080, C08-026, S08-027, H08-075, H08-026, H08-022

and H08-023 (see attached map);

During this public meeting, the Borough Mayor (or another designated member of the Borough Council) will explain the draft by-law as well as the consequences of its adoption and will hear from people who wish to speak about it.

The draft by-law is available for consultation at the Citizens' Office, during regular office hours.
