

PUBLIC NOTICE

Notice is given that a regular city council meeting will be held on:

Date **Monday, April 15, 2024, at 1 p.m.**

Place Lucien-Saulnier building, council chamber
155, rue Notre-Dame Est
(Champ-de-Mars metro station)

Please note that the public question period will not be held at the beginning of the meeting, but rather at 7 p.m.

Anyone who wishes to ask questions in person can obtain their registration number between 5 p.m. and 6:30 p.m., on the **1st floor of the Lucien-Saulnier building, located at 155, rue Notre-Dame Est (hall d'honneur)**. The draw determining the order in which people may ask their questions will take place at 6:30 p.m. Should the meeting continue on Tuesday, April 16, 2024, the registration period will begin at 8:30 a.m. and the draw at 9 a.m., at the same location. It is imperative that residents provide a picture ID for registration purposes.

Members of the public can also ask elected officials questions by submitting their questions electronically **before 1 p.m., on Monday, April 15, 2024**, via an online form, according to the instructions posted on the city's website at montreal.ca, on the page of the January 23, 2023 regular city council meeting. Full details on the procedure for public questions (in person and via the online form) are provided on the website.

People registered for the in-person question period as well as people who wish to attend council deliberations may access the Lucien-Saulnier building using the main entrance at 155, rue Notre-Dame Est.

An interpretation service for persons with a hearing disability is available on request, subject to the availability of interpreters. If you require this service, please call 514-872-3142, at least three business days prior to the meeting.

The city now offers a drop-in day-care centre during council meeting question periods, from 5 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. on Monday nights. This service is offered free of charge, by bilingual (French/English) professional childhood educators, and is available without prior reservation. Upon arrival, parents must fill out a short form giving details on food safety, access to the child and specific needs. Parents must also supply required food, diapers and creams.
