MANDATE OF THE INTERCULTURAL COMMISSION

The mandate of the Intercultural Commission is to foster tolerance, dialogue and healthy intercultural relations. The Commission encourages cultural communities to get to know each other and the host community and promotes harmony among all the different communities, in addition to celebrating the intercultural wealth and diversity of our multiethnic, multicultural and multiracial borough.

MANDATE OF THE PLANNING ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Planning Advisory Committee is an advisory committee that makes recommendations to the borough council on a variety of planning matters, including applications for minor exemptions, site plan development, architectural integration and implementation plans, all draft by-laws intended to amend the urban by-law, and zoning, minor exemption and subdivision by-laws or any other urban, zoning and subdivision matters.

In addition, the Planning Advisory Committee studies and decides on applications for demolition permits.

SELECTION CRITERIA

In general, every applicant must:

- be a resident of our borough;
- have a good knowledge of French;
- be available to attend assemblies and meetings to study specific matters.

Anyone wishing to become a member of the INTERCULTURAL COMMISSION must:

- show interest in and have experience in intercultural relations;
- have knowledge of municipal issues;
- have actively participated in one or more of the economic, cultural, scientific, community or educational dimensions of Montréal life.

Anyone wishing to become a member of the PLANNING ADVISORY COMMITTEE must:

- be familiar with the physical, geographical and human environment of our borough;
- be involved in the community;
- possess expertise, knowledge or some training in urban, development, architectural or cultural heritage.

Anyone interested in becoming a regular member of the INTERCULTURAL COMMISSION and/or a substitute member of the PLANNING ADVISORY COMMITTEE must send an introductory letter, with a résumé if desired, explaining why he or she wishes to become a member.
