Notice is given that a **special urban agglomeration council meeting** will be held as follows:

Date **Thursday, January 29, 2026, at 9:30 a.m.**

Place Council chamber of city hall  
275, rue Notre-Dame Est  
(Champ-de-Mars metro station)

The special meeting of **January 29, 2026**, will pertain to the adoption of the 2026-2035 ten-year capital works program (urban agglomeration component), the adoption of the 2026 budget (urban agglomeration component), the approval of the capital works program for 2026-2035 and of the 2026 budget of the Société de transport de Montréal, as well as the approval of the 2026 budgets of certain paramunicipal agencies.

Please note that the question period and council deliberations during this meeting will pertain to the above-mentioned topics exclusively, in accordance with Section 474.2 of the Cities and Towns Act.

Anyone who wishes to ask questions in person must be present one hour prior to the meeting on **the ground floor of city hall, located at 275 rue Notre-Dame Est** to obtain a registration number. The draw determining the order in which people may ask their questions will take place 30 minutes prior to the meeting to obtain a registration number. It is imperative that citizens provide a picture ID for registration purposes.

Members of the public can also ask elected officials questions by submitting their questions electronically **before 6:30 a.m., on Thursday, January 29, 2026**, using the online form, according to the instructions posted on the city's website at [montreal.ca](http://montreal.ca), on the page of the January 29, 2026 special urban agglomeration council meeting. Full details on the procedure for public questions (in person and via the online form) are provided on the website.

People registered for the in-person question period as well as people who wish to attend council deliberations may access city hall using the door on the west side (place Vauquelin) or east side (rue Gosford).
