The standing committee on finance and administration ([Commission sur les finances et l'administration](#)) is inviting Montrealers to take part in a public review of the 2026 operating budget and of the 2026-2035 Ten-year capital works program (PDI) of Montréal, its paramunicipal organizations and the Société de transport de Montréal (STM).

Employees of municipal departments, paramunicipal organizations and the STM will present their 2026 budget, and some will also present the 2026-2035 PDI.
